1. Repeal of so much of the Native Land Purchase Ordinance as inhibits all persons

except the Surveyor General or some

other officer from sueing for the commission of offences against the provisions thereof,

2. Short Title.

An Act to Amend the Native Land Purchase Ordinance of the late Title.

Legislative Council of New Zealand.

WHEREAS, by an ordinance of the late Legislative Council for the Colony of New Zealand, passed during the seventh session thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the Prevention, by Preamble. Summary Proceeding of Unauthorised Purchases or Leases of Land," it was amongst other things, enacted, that no person should be convicted of any of the offences therein mentioned, except on the information or complaint of the Surveyor General, or of some other officer duly authorised in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor: And whereas it is expedient to repeal so much of the said Ordinance as aforesaid: Be it enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Auckland with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:

Repeal of part of recited Ordinance.

1. So much of the said recited Ordinance as provides that no person shall be convicted of any of the Offences mentioned in such Ordinance, except on the information or complaint of the Surveyor General of the said Colony, or of some other Officer duly authorised in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor of the said Colony, is hereby repealed.

Short Title.

2. The short title of this Act shall be "The Native Land Purchase Ordinance Amendment Act."
