The Parliament of New Zealand enacts as follows:

1 Title

This Act is the Accident Compensation Amendment Act 2016.

2 Commencement

- (1) This Act comes into force on a date appointed by the Governor-General by 5 Order in Council, and 1 or more Orders in Council may be made bringing different provisions into force on different dates.
- (2) Any provision that has not earlier been brought into force comes into force on the day that is 2 years after the date on which this Act receives the Royal assent.
