Education (National Education and Learning Priorities) Amendment Bill

Member's Bill

Explanatory note

General policy statement

This Bill amends the Education Act 1989 to enable statements about the diversity of education provision to be included in the statement of National Education and Learning Priorities.

The amendments proposed in the Bill will align the statement of National Education and Learning Priorities more closely with the New Zealand Curriculum and provide an aspirational vision for the future for young New Zealanders.

Clause by clause analysis

Clause 1 is the Title clause.

Clause 2 provides for the Act to come into force 3 months after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

Clause 3 states that the Act being amended is the Education Act 1989.

Clause 4 amends section 1A so as to ensure that the National Education and Learning Priorities are aligned with the New Zealand Curriculum and provide an aspirational vision for the future for young New Zealanders.

1 Title

This Act is the Education (National Education and Learning Priorities) Amendment Act **2017**.

2 Commencement

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This Act comes into force 3 months after the date on which it receives the Royal Assent.

3 Principal Act

This Act amends the Education Act 1989 (the principal Act).
