An Act to amend the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:**1 Short Title and commencement**

- (1) This Act may be cited as the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Amendment Act 1999, and is part of the Mutual Assistance in Criminal Matters Act 1992 (“the principal Act”).
- (2) This Act comes into force on the day after the date on which it receives the Royal assent.

2 Application of this Part

This section amended Section 24(1)(b) of the principal Act.

3 Limitations on requests by convention countries

- (1) This subsection amended Section 24A(1) of the principal Act.
- (2) This subsection amended Section 24A(2) of the principal Act.
- (3) This subsection substituted Section 24A(3) to 24A(5) of the principal Act.

4 Further limitations on requests by convention countries

This section inserted section 24B into the principal Act.

5 Schedule 1 amended

Schedule 1 of the principal Act is amended by adding the Parts set out in Schedule 1 of this Act.

6 Schedule 2 amended

Schedule 2 of the principal Act is amended by adding the Part set out in Schedule 2 of this Act.
