



## **Customs and Excise Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2010**

### **Order in Council**

At Wellington this 26th day of July 2010

Present:

His Excellency the Governor-General in Council

Pursuant to section 286(ff) of the Customs and Excise Act 1996, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following regulations.

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## Regulations

- 1 Title**

These regulations are the Customs and Excise Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2010.
- 2 Commencement**

These regulations come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 3 Principal regulations amended**

These regulations amend the Customs and Excise Regulations 1996.
- 4 Schedule 2 amended**

Schedule 2 is amended by revoking forms 3 and 3A and substituting the forms 3 and 3A set out in the Schedule of these regulations.

**New Zealand passenger arrival card**

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**NEW ZEALAND PASSENGER ARRIVAL CARD** 0102 3411

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- This Arrival Card is a legal document – false declarations can lead to penalties including confiscation of goods, fines, prosecution, imprisonment, and removal from New Zealand.
- A separate Arrival Card must be completed for each passenger, including children.
- Please answer in English and fill in BOTH sides.
- Print in capital letters like this: **NEW ZEALAND** or mark answers like this:

- are alcohol and tobacco products; or
- are for business or commercial use; or

- are of any other kind (except clothing, toiletries, or jewellery intended for your own personal use and not for gift, sale, or exchange).

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**Explanatory note**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations, which come into force on the 28th day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*, amend Schedule 2 of the Customs and Excise Regulations 1996 by—

- replacing form 3 (passenger arrival card) with a new simplified form;
  - replacing form 3A (Customs declared goods) to reflect consequential changes to cross-references in that form.
