Regulations

1 Title

These regulations are the District Courts and High Court (Criminal Fees) Amendment Regulations 2024.

2 Commencement

These regulations come into force on 1 July 2024.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the regulations but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 2024, amend the District Courts and High Court (Criminal Fees) Regulations 2013 to increase fees relating to criminal proceedings in the District and High Courts. These regulations implement a 10% increase to fees payable for—

- filing a charging document under section 14 or 26(1) of the Criminal Procedure Act 2011 (the Act):
- hearing a charge under the Act:
- applying for a reduction or partial exemption of a disqualification or disqualifications under the Land Transport Act 1998:
- accessing documents relating to criminal proceedings.

Those fees are inclusive of goods and services tax.

Regulatory impact statement
