## **Notice**

#### 1 Title

This notice is the Health Practitioners (Protected Quality Assurance Activity—Australian and New Zealand Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons) Notice 2024.

# 2 Commencement

This notice comes into force on the 28th day after its notification in the Gazette.

## 3 Interpretation

In this notice,—

**ANZAOMS** means the Australian and New Zealand Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons

**specified health practitioner** means an oral and maxillofacial surgeon who is a member of ANZAOMS

**surgery** means temporomandibular joint replacement surgery and **surgical** has a corresponding meaning.

# 4 Declaration of protected quality assurance activities

The following quality assurance activities are protected to the extent that they are undertaken by ANZAOMS in relation to specified health practitioners:

- (a) collecting surgical data using a temporomandibular joint form:
- (b) collecting patient-reported outcome measure data from patients, before and after surgery, using the data capture platform known as RAPID:
- (c) collecting and analysing data from surgeries undertaken on or after 1 January 2000:
- (d) reporting surgical data to all stakeholders, including surgeons, patients, health departments, hospitals, government regulators, and device manufacturers.

# **Explanatory note**

This note is not part of the notice but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This notice comes into force 28 days after its notification in the *Gazette*. It declares the quality assurance activities described in *clause 4* to be protected.

Quality assurance activities are activities undertaken to improve the practices or competence of health practitioners by assessing the health services performed by those practitioners. The effect of protecting a quality assurance activity is that—

- any information that becomes known solely as a result of the activity is confidential:
- any documents brought into existence solely for the purposes of the activity are confidential:
- the persons who engage in the activity in good faith are immune from civil liability.

The protections afforded by this notice are subject to certain statutory exceptions. For example, this notice does not prohibit the disclosure of information that does not identify, either expressly or by implication, a particular individual.

This notice remains in force for 5 years, unless sooner revoked.
