Pursuant to section 32 of the Ombudsmen Act 1975, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

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Order

1 Title

This order is the Ombudsmen Act (Schedule 1—Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority) Order 2014.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 1 February 2015.

3 Part 1 of Schedule 1 of Ombudsmen Act 1975 amended In the Ombudsmen Act 1975, Schedule 1, Part 1, repeal the item relating to the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority.

4 Revocation

The Ombudsmen Act (Schedule 1—Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority) Order 2011 (SR 2011/66) is revoked.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 February 2015, removes the Canterbury Earthquake Recovery Authority (CERA) from Part 1 of Schedule 1 of the Ombudsmen Act 1975 (which lists the government departments to which that Act applies). CERA is being disestablished as a government department and established instead as a departmental agency hosted by the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet. The Ombudsmen Act 1975 and the Official Information Act 1982 will apply to CERA as a departmental agency, because they apply to its host department, the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.
