An Act relating to Coroners' Juries.

[14th September, 1885.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Coroners Act 1867

Amendment Act, 1885."

2. The concurrence of four jurors in a verdict at any inquest or inquiry taken by or before any coroner by virtue of his office shall be sufficient, and not more than six persons shall at any time be required to constitute a jury at any such inquest or inquiry.
