AN ACT to confer certain Powers on the Dunedin City Council. Title.  
[25th October, 1935.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Dunedin City Empowering Act, 1935. Short Title.

2. In this Act, if not inconsistent with the context, " Council " means the Dunedin City Council. Interpretation.

3. The Council may from time to time make such by-laws as it thinks fit for the purpose of regulating or controlling the use of vehicles of any kind between the hours of eight o'clock in the evening of every day and six o'clock in the morning of the following day in order to prevent undue noise in those parts of King Street and Cumberland Street in the City of Dunedin situated between Frederick Street and Hanover Street. Power to make by-laws to prevent undue noise from vehicular traffic in certain streets.
