Title.

AN ACT to extend the Powers of the Trustees of the Dunedin Garrison Hall. 5th November, 1904.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Dunedin Garrison Hall Trustees Empowering Act, 1904.”

2. Notwithstanding anything in “The Volunteer Drill-sheds and Lands Act, 1888,” the proceeds of the sale by the Trustees of the Dunedin Garrison Hall of the lands now vested in them under the said Act shall be applied—

- (a.) First, in payment of all liabilities of the said Trustees (including all debentures issued by such Trustees under “The Dunedin Garrison Hall Trustees Empowering Act 1893 Amendment Act, 1896”):
- (b.) Secondly, in the purchase of a new site for a drill-shed, and the erection and equipment of a new drill-shed and other buildings thereon: Provided that the plans of such drill-shed and its equipment shall be subject to the approval of the Minister of Defence.
- (c.) The balance of such proceeds shall be invested in such securities as may be approved by the Minister of Defence, and the income therefrom applied towards the upkeep and further equipment of the new drill-shed, and towards the support and encouragement of the Volunteer Force, in such manner as the Trustees may from time to time, with the approval of the Minister of Defence, determine, and towards the management and care of the said drill-shed and of the said balance and the securities therefor.

3. If at any time after the erection of such new drill-shed and other buildings it is desired to enlarge the same, the Trustees, with the approval of the Minister of Defence, may realise any securities in which for the time being any such balance may be invested and apply the proceeds to such enlargement.
