2. Electrical wiring work which may be done by any person

An Act to amend the Electricians Act 1952

[25 October 1960]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Electricians Amendment Act 1960, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Electricians Act 1952* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Electrical wiring work which may be done by any person—The principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after section 20, the following section:

“20A. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Act, any person may, in accordance with this section, do all or any of the following types of electrical wiring work:

“(a) Replace a fuse link:

“(b) Affix a plug or an adaptor or a cord extension socket or an appliance connector to a flexible cord, not being a flexible cord forming part of or directly connected to the fixed wiring.

“(2) Subsection (1) of this section shall not apply to any electrical wiring work, unless the work is carried out without payment or reward, and in a workmanlike manner, and in accordance with instructions issued or approved by the General Manager of the New Zealand Electricity Department for the purposes of this section and for the time being in force.

“(3) Terms and expressions used in this section shall have the same meaning as in the Electricians Registration Regulations 1956.”
