An Act relating to the Depositing and Disposal of Rubbish, Title. Refuse, or Nightsoil within the Heathcote Road District.

[16th September, 1899.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Heathcote Road District Short Title. Sanitation Act, 1899"; and it shall come into force on the first day

of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.

2. The Heathcote Road Board may from time to time appoint, Heathcote Road in writing under the hand of its Clerk, places as depots or receptacles Board may appoint for the depositing or disposal of rubbish, refuse, or nightsoil within of rubbish, refuse, the Heathcote Road District, and make regulations relating thereto; but no such place or depot shall be appointed or remain so appointed unless situated at least fifteen chains from a public road or from any dwellinghouse; and any such appointment may be from time to time revoked by the Board upon sufficient cause for so doing being established.

3. Any person depositing or disposing of rubbish, refuse, or renalty. nightsoil on any land or premises within the Heathcote Road District, not being a place for the time being appointed under the second section hereof, shall be hable to a penalty of not exceeding five pounds for every such offence.

4. The Heathcote Road Board may from time to time make May allow deposit by-laws enabling any person, in accordance with such conditions as of rubbish, &c., on may be prescribed by such by-laws, to deposit or dispose on the lands or premises occupied by him of rubbish, refuse, or nightsoil not conveved thereto from outside the limits of such land or premises; and any such by-laws may be from time to time amended or revoked, and any such by-laws may provide for the imposition of a penalty of not exceeding five pounds for any breach thereof.

Not to interfere with reserves.

5. Nothing in this Act shall be deemed to prevent the deposit of rubbish, refuse, or nightsoil by any public body on any reserve at present used for that purpose, or on any parcel of land which may hereafter be vested in or leased by any public body for the like purpose: Provided that no deposit shall be made within fifteen chains of a public road, a dwellinghouse, or the boundary of such land.
