

An Act to appropriate certain Sums of Money for the Thile. purposes of Immigration and Public Works.

[19th December, 1879.]

OST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—Whereas by the several Acts Address.
of the General Assembly mentioned in the Trivial Control of the General Co of the General Assembly mentioned in the First Schedule to this Act certain sums of money, amounting in the whole to the sum of eighteen millions seven hundred thousand pounds, have been authorized to be raised by loan; and by the said Acts, and by the several Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Act, various sums of the moneys so to be raised have been authorized to be issued and applied to the several works and services mentioned in the said Acts and the Schedules thereto; and various sums of money, amounting in the whole to the sum of thirteen millions five hundred and fiftyseven thousand nine hundred and fifty-six pounds five shillings and sixpence, have been so issued and applied as in the third column of the Third Schedule to this Act set forth: And whereas it is expedient that a portion of the unexpended balance of the moneys so authorized to be raised, together with other moneys in the Fourth Schedule mentioned, should be appropriated for carrying on the said works and services:

We, Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty, towards making good the Supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as

follows:---

Short Title.

1. This Act shall be called "The Immigration and Public Works Appropriation Act, 1879," and shall be deemed to have been in operation on and after the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine.

Grant of £4,117,710 12s. 1d.

2. Towards defraying the expenses hereinafter mentioned, the Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply any sum or sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of four millions one hundred and seventeen thousand seven hundred and ten pounds twelve shillings and one penny out of the several Ways and Means mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to this Act.

Appropriations.

3. All sums so issued shall be applied, as mentioned in the several votes set forth in the Fifth Schedule to this Act, towards defraying so much of the expenses incurred or to be incurred in the several works and services in the said Schedule mentioned as shall come in the course of payment during the nine months ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Issue to temporary general account.

Proviso.

4. Whenever it is not possible to determine at the time of payment to which particular vote mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereto the cost of any material or other expense should be charged, the Colonial Treasurer may notwithstanding issue and pay the same out of the several Ways and Means mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto: Provided that he shall from time to time carry each such payment to and charge the same against the vote on account of which such payment was made, so soon as the same can be ascertained: Provided also that all such expenditure shall be included in and shall not be in excess of the total sum hereby authorized to be issued and paid under each vote in the Fifth Schedule mentioned.

Power to alter votes. Unauthorized expenditure. 5. Nothing in this Act shall limit the authority of the Colonial Treasurer to issue and pay any moneys which he may be otherwise authorized to issue and pay under the authority of the thirty-seventh or forty-fourth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878."

Indemnity.

6. And whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority of the forty-fourth section of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," issued from the Public Account, during the year ending the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, moneys in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, amounting in the whole to thirty-two thousand one hundred and seventy-nine pounds one shilling and one penny, and has applied the said sum to the several purposes and services mentioned in the Sixth Schedule hereto annexed: Be it enacted that the application of the said sum is hereby sanctioned.

Moneys appropriated to works may be paid in terms agreed upon.

7. The moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of works and for other purposes may be paid over to such local governing bodies as the Minister for Public Works may determine, upon such terms and conditions as shall be agreed upon between the said Minister and any such local governing body, and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments in accordance with any such agreement.

8. And whereas by "The Appropriation Act, 1879," it was Sums granted and provided that all sums expended under the authority thereof should be "The Appropriation finally charged in the accounts of the colony for the year ending the Act, 1879," included thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty, in the in this Act. manner thereafter to be expressed in any Act or Acts passed in the then or present session of Parliament for appropriating the Public Revenues of the colony for the said year:

Be it enacted:

The several sums granted and appropriated by this Act shall be taken and deemed to be inclusive of and not in excess of the several

sums granted and appropriated by the said "Appropriation Act, 1879."

9. The Schedules from one to seven, both inclusive, annexed schedules included hereto, with the notes, if any, to such Schedules, shall be deemed to in this Act. be part of this Act, in the same manner as if they had been contained in the body hereof.
