An Act to amend the Immigration Restriction Act 1908 [25 October 1960]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Immigration Restriction Amendment Act 1960, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Immigration Restriction Act 1908.*

2. Entry permit obtained by false representation, etc.— The Immigration Restriction Amendment Act 1920 is hereby amended by inserting, after section 12, the following section:

"12A. Where, whether before or after the commencement of this section and whether in New Zealand or elsewhere, any person to whom this Part of this Act applies (in this section referred to as the applicant), or any person on his behalf, for the purpose of any application for the grant of a permit authorising the applicant to enter into New Zealand—

- "(a) Produces to an officer of Customs any certificate, passport, visa, identification card, or other document that purports to have been issued to or in respect of the applicant but was issued to or in respect of some person other than the applicant, or that was forged or was obtained by any false representation or contains any statement that is false or misleading in any material particular; or
- "(b) Makes any statement that is false or misleading in any material particular,---

any permit granted to the applicant pursuant to the application, whether before or after the commencement of this section, shall be void and of no effect, and, if the applicant enters into New Zealand, then, notwithstanding the grant to him of an entry permit pursuant to the application, he shall be deemed to have entered New Zealand without having previously obtained a permit to enter, contrary to the provisions of section 9 of this Act."
