AN ACT to amend "The Immigration Restriction Act, 1899." Title.

[Reserved for the signification of His Majesty's pleasure thereon.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Immigration Restriction Act Amendment Act, 1906"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Immigration Restriction Act, 1899" (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act"). Short Title.

2. Paragraph four of section three of the principal Act is hereby repealed, and the following substituted in lieu thereof:— Persons convicted in other countries prohibited from landing in New Zealand.

"(4.) Any person the date of whose arrival in New Zealand is earlier than two years after the termination of any imprisonment suffered by him in respect of any offence which, if committed in New Zealand, would be punishable by death, or imprisonment for two years or upwards, not being a mere political offence, and no pardon having been granted."
