An Acr to apply a Sum of Money out of the Public Account and Title. other Accounts to the Service of the Year ending the Thirtyfirst Day of March, One thousand nine hundred.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as fol-

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Imprest Supply Act, Short Title,

1899 (No. 3)."

2. In addition to all sums otherwise granted, there may be Imprest grants. issued and applied, by way of imprest, towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred,—

- (1.) Out of the respective funds and accounts (being part of the Public Account) specified in the First Schedule hereto, · any sums of money not exceeding in the whole three hundred and thirty-six thousand pounds, as set forth in Schedule:
- (2.) Out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, the respective sums therein set forth, not exceeding in the whole nine thousand pounds;
- (3.) Out of the Consolidated Fund, for transfer to the Public Works Fund, any sums not exceeding fifty thousand pounds.
- 3. The aforesaid sums shall be charged in the manner hereafter To be charged as to be expressed in any Act or Acts passed in this present session of expressed in future Parliament for appropriating the public revenues of the colony for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred.
