Title. 1. Short Title.

AN ACT to amend "The Legislative Council Act, 1891." Title. [10th April, 1897.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Legislative Council Act Short Title. Amendment Act, 1897."

2. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in "The Prolongation of Legislative Council Act, 1891," or the Standing Orders of the Legislative Council, it is hereby declared as follows: Whereas the term events. for which the present Speaker of the Legislative Council has been appointed may expire when Parliament is not in session, he shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, continue to hold office until fourteen days after the commencement of the next session which shall be held after the expiration of such term, or until the election of his successor, whichever event shall first happen.

3. If the office of Speaker of the Legislative Council shall Appointment of become vacant, the Chairman of Committees for the time being, or the last-elected Chairman of Committees, of the said Council shall have all the powers, rights, and privileges of the Speaker until the election of a Speaker.
