Title.

AN ACT to amend "The Maori Councils Act, 1900."

[8th November, 1901.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Maori Councils Act Amendment Act, 1901"; and it shall form part of and be read together with "The Maori Councils Act, 1900" (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

Amendments of principal Act.

2. The principal Act is hereby amended as follows, that is to say:—

(1.) Section sixteen thereof is hereby amended—

(a.) By adding thereto the following subsection:—

"(20.) For the regulation and control of Maori meetings or hui."

(b.) By adding to the section the following words: "The Council is hereby empowered to carry out and enforce such by-laws when the same come into operation, and may, subject to the approval of the Native Minister, adopt such forms of procedure as may be most suitable for inquiry and decision in regard to any breach of such by-laws."

(2.) Section seventeen thereof is hereby amended by adding thereto the following proviso:—

"Provided that the Council, if it thinks fit, may appoint a Village Committee (Komiti Marae) for a group of two or more kaingas, villages, or pas."

(3.) Section twenty-nine thereof is hereby amended by adding thereto the following as the first proviso to subsection one:—

"Provided that the Council may appoint the Advisory Counsellor as its delegate."
