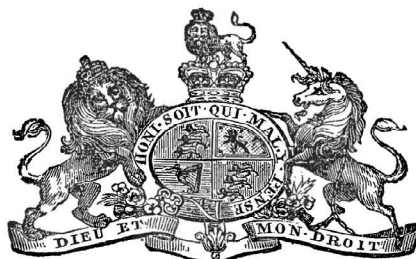

AN ACT to authorise the Sale of a Particular Section of Land to Title.
George McLean, of Hawera. [24th September, 1891.]

WHEREAS the Waste Lands Committee of the House of Representatives, in a report dated the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, have recommended that a sale of a particular section of land should be authorised to George McLean, of Hawera, at a price not exceeding the original upset of land in the Taranaki Land District: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is “The McLean Land Act, Short Title.
1891.”

2. The Governor may sell to George McLean, of Hawera, at a price to be fixed by the Commissioner of Crown Lands at New Plymouth not exceeding the upset price of land in the Hawera District at the time when the Native Contingent Military Settlers’ Block, in the said district, was first open to selection by military settlers, not exceeding eighty acres, more or less, of land within section number one hundred of the aforesaid block, containing ninety-one acres; such eighty acres to be selected by the aforesaid George McLean, and approved by the aforesaid Commissioner. Governor may sell
eighty acres to G.
McLean, of Hawera.
