An Act to amend the Military Training Act 1949. [17 September 1954]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Military Training Short Title. Amendment Act 1954, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Military Training Act 1949 1949, No. 23 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Section three of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding to subsection one the following proviso:

Liability for service to cease at age of thirty years.

"Provided that the liability of every person for service under this Part of this Act shall cease on the day on which he attains the age of thirty years, unless it has previously terminated."

3. Section twenty-eight of the principal Act is hereby Application amended by repealing subsection five, and substituting the following subsections:

"(5) Any person who has applied for registration for unconditional service in the armed forces, and is registered in the registration, by military service register accordingly, may at any time already apply under this section to be registered as a conscientious registered. objector. Upon the receipt of any such application the

for registration as a conscientious objector, or for a person

Director, besides complying with section twenty-nine of this Act, shall cause the registration of the applicant in the military service register to be cancelled.

"(6) Any person who has applied to be registered as a conscientious objector as a person liable to be called up for service but to be employed only in non-combatant duties, and is registered in the register of conscientious objectors accordingly, may at any time apply under this section to be unconditionally registered in the register of conscientious objectors. Upon the receipt of any such application the Director, besides complying with section twenty-nine of this Act, shall cause the existing registration of the applicant in the register of conscientious objectors to be cancelled."
