AN ORDINANCE for the Naturalization of certain Persons NATURALIZATION.
in the Colony of New Zealand.

[18th November, 1848.]

WHEREAS the persons particularly described in the Schedule to Preamble.
this Ordinance annexed have settled in this Colony, and it is
expedient that there should be removed from them (within this
Colony) the disabilities to which aliens are by law subject :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Governor-in-Chief of New
Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof,
as follows :—

1. All and singular the persons who are particularly described in Persons described in
Schedule to be
naturalized.
the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be to all intents and purposes
whatsoever within the Colony of New Zealand deemed and taken to
be and to have been, from the first day of January, one thousand eight
hundred and forty-three, natural-born subjects of Her Majesty, as if
they had respectively been born within the realm of England.
