Title.	AN ACT to amend “The Newmarket Hall Act, 1874.” [2nd October, 1893.]
Preamble.	WHEREAS it is expedient to amend an Act passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the now abolished Province of Auckland, intituled “The Newmarket Hall Act, 1874,” hereinafter termed “the said Act”:
	BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
Short Title.	1. The Short Title of this Act is “The Newmarket Hall Act 1874 Amendment Act, 1893.”
Land, how vested.	2. Section two of the said Act is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof it is enacted as follows:— The management and administration of the said land, and of any buildings now or hereafter to be erected thereon, is hereby vested in the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Newmarket.
Repeal.	3. Section eight of the said Act is hereby repealed.
Amendment of said Act.	4. Sections three, four, and five of the said Act are hereby amended by the insertion of the words “the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Newmarket,” in lieu of the word “Committee,” wherever the last-mentioned word occurs in the said sections.
