- Title.** AN ACT to amend the New Plymouth Harbour Board Empowering Act 1951. [22 October 1952]
- BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
- Short Title.** 1. This Act may be cited as the New Plymouth Harbour Board Empowering Amendment Act 1952, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the New Plymouth Harbour Board Empowering Act 1951 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).
- Section 4 of principal Act (as to power to borrow) amended.** 2. Section four of the principal Act is hereby amended by omitting the words “one hundred and eighty-five thousand pounds”, and substituting the words “four hundred and eighty-five thousand pounds”.
- Authorizing debentures as trustee investment.** 3. It shall be lawful for a trustee, unless expressly forbidden by the instrument (if any) expressly creating the trust, to invest any trust funds in his hands in any debentures or other securities issued or created by the New Plymouth Harbour Board, if the repayment of the loan to which those debentures or other securities relate, and interest thereon, is secured by a special rate made and levied by the Board for the purposes of the loan.

4. The principal Act is hereby amended by repealing the Second Schedule, and substituting the new Second Schedule set out in the Schedule to this Act.
