AN ACT to provide for vesting in the Crown Public Reserves appropriated to purposes connected with the General Government administration.

Title.

[10th October 1867.]

WHEREAS divers lands which under and by virtue of "The Public Reserves Act 1854" have been granted to Superintendents of Provinces and lands which have been reserved for public purposes but not so granted have been appropriated as sites for custom houses post offices Magistrates' Courts gaols telegraph offices and other public buildings for the use of the General Government and to purposes connected with the General Government administration or it is desirable that they should be so appropriated and whereas it is desirable to make provision for vesting the same in the Crown

Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Public Buildings Reserves Act 1867."

Short Title.

2. Whenever any land in any Province which under and by virtue of "The Public Reserves Act 1854" has been or shall be granted to the Superintendent of such Province upon any trust whatever has been or shall be appropriated set apart or used as the site of any custom house post office Magistrates' Court gaol telegraph office or other public building for the use of the General Government or any department thereof or for any purpose of public utility or convenience connected with the administration of the Government of New Zealand it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of such Province to surrender such land to the Crown.

Superintendent may surrender lands granted appropriated for General Government purposes.

3. Any such land when so surrendered shall vest in Her Majesty the Queen free from and discharged of any trust upon which such land may have been granted to such Superintendent and such land shall thenceforth be deemed to be land reserved under the twelfth section of "The Waste Lands Act 1858" and subject to be dealt with as such.

Lands so surrendered how to vest.

4. Every such surrender may be in the form in the Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

Form of surrender.

5. Whenever any land not included in any Crown Grant in any Province shall have been or shall be reserved for any public purpose whatever by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of any Province and shall have been or shall be appropriated set apart or used as the site of any custom house post office Magistrates' Court gaol telegraph office or other public building for the use of the General Government or any department thereof or for any purpose of public

utility or convenience connected with the General Government administration it shall be lawful for the Governor after he shall have received a resolution agreed to by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of such Province for the time being to declare by a proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* that such land shall thenceforth cease to be a reserve for the public purpose for which the same shall have been originally reserved and that the same shall be a reserve for such public purpose as the Governor shall declare in and by such proclamation and thereupon such land shall thenceforth be deemed to be land reserved under the twelfth section of "The Waste Lands Act 1858" and subject to be dealt with as such.
