An Act to amend the Property Law Act 1952

[16 December 1977]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. Short Title—This Act may be cited as the Property Law Amendment Act 1977, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Property Law Act 1952 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. Restrictions requiring sterility—The principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after section 33A (as inserted by section 2 of the Property Law Amendment Act 1965), the following section:

“33B. (1) Any provision in or in connection with any disposition of property (whether oral or in writing) made after the commencement of this section shall be void to the extent that its effect would be to require any party to the disposition, or any of his successors in title, or the spouse of any such party or successor, to be or to undertake to become sterile.

“(2) For the purposes of this section, the term ‘disposition’ has the same meaning as it has in section 33A of this Act.

“(3) This section shall bind the Crown.”
