AN ACT to amend the Town Boards Act, 1908.

[17th September, 1910.]

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Town Boards Amendment Act, 1910, and it shall form part of and be read together with the Town Boards Act, 1908 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act). Short Title.

2. The powers conferred upon Borough Councils by sections eighty-three to ninety of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1908, are hereby also conferred upon Town Boards; and all references in those sections to a Council shall be deemed to be references to a Board, and all references therein to a borough shall be deemed to be references to a town district. Extension of rating-powers of Boards

3. (1.) Where power is given to a Board under the principal Act to do anything by special order, that power shall be exercised only as follows:— Special orders.

(a.) The resolution to do such thing shall be passed at a special meeting.

(b.) That resolution shall be confirmed at a subsequent meeting (either ordinary or special) held not sooner than the twenty-eighth day after the day of such special meeting, and not later than the forty-second day after such special meeting.

(c.) Public notice of the place and date fixed for such subsequent meeting, and of such resolution, shall be given once in each full week intervening between the two meetings.

(d.) For the purposes of the last preceding paragraph a week shall be computed from the day of the week on which the resolution was passed.

(2.) Paragraph (b) of section thirty-one of the principal Act is hereby repealed. Repeal.
