

3. Court may sentence certain offenders to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding two years with or without hard labour, instead of penal servitude.

AN ACT to amend "The Post Office Act, 1858." Title.
[15th September, 1873.]

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Post Office Act Amendment Act, 1873." Short Title.

2. In this Act the expression "the said Act" means "The Post Office Act, 1858." Interpretation.

3. Every person convicted of any offence punishable according to the said Act by penal servitude for life, or for any other term, shall be liable, at the discretion of the Court, to be kept in penal servitude for any such term as is authorized by the said Act, or to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding two years, with or without hard labour. Court may sentence certain offenders to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding two years with or without hard labour, instead of penal servitude.
