## **AN ACT to authorize the removal of** Title. **Prisoners from one Gaol to another.** *[30th October 1865.]*

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to amend the law relating to the removal of prisoners from one gaol to another

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand Preamble. in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

I. The Short Title of this Act shall be “The Prisoners’ Removal Short Title. Act 1865.”

II. The Governor may by warrant under his hand from time to time Governor may direct removal of prisoners. when and as he may deem necessary direct the removal from any gaol or hulk of any prisoner confined therein to any other gaol or hulk within New Zealand and upon every such removal every such prisoner shall be subject to be kept at such gaol or hulk for the residue of his sentence or until removed by legal authority.

III. It shall be lawful for the Governor in Council under his hand Governor may delegate powers conferred by this Act to Superintendents of Provinces. and the public seal of the Colony from time to time to delegate to the Superintendent of any Province the powers hereby vested in the Governor to be exercised within such Province and not elsewhere and may from time to time in like manner rescind any such delegation.

IV. When a prisoner shall be received into a prison by removal from another prison it shall be lawful under the rules in force in the prison Punishment of prisoners for misconduct during removal from one prison to another. into which he is so received to punish him for any misconduct which he may have committed in the course of such removal or within forty-eight hours before the commencement of the same as if such misconduct had been committed by him within the prison into which he is so received.
