AN ACT to regulate Attachment of Wages. Title.

[20th September, 1895.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :--

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Wages Attachment Short Title. Act, 1895."

2. From and after the coming into operation of this Act no No order to be made order attaching or charging the wages of any workman shall be made attaching wages. by any Court, or any Judge or Magistrate, except as hereinafter mentioned.

3. If the amount of wages exceeds at the rate of two pounds Liebility to per week, any surplus above that sum shall be liable to attachment as attachments. before the passing of this Act; but the costs or expenses of any such costs. attachment shall not be chargeable against the workman unless by virtue of such attachment the creditor shall recover a sum equal to or greater than the amount of such costs and expenses.

4. This Act shall not affect any order now or which hereafter Limitation may be made under "The Industrial Schools Act, 1882," or "The of Act. Destitute Persons Act, 1894."

5. The word "workman" shall have the meaning assigned to it "workman" by "The Workmen's Wages Act, 1893."
