## A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to enable Affirmations and Declarations to be taken in lieu of Oaths, Title, BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Affirmations and Declarations Act, Short Title. 1883."

any person is required or permitted to take an oath, such person may make a solemn affirmation and declaration in the manner prescribed by this Act, instead 10 of taking an oath; and, in any case where any person objects to the taking of an oath, every Committee of either House of the General Assembly, Court, tribunal, authority, or person authorized, permitted, or required to allow an

oath to be taken before it or him, shall accept such affirmation and declaration instead of an oath.

3. Where a specific form of oath to be taken has been prescribed by any Form of affirmation 15 law or enactment now or that may hereafter be in force, the form of affirmation and declaration where and declaration to be made instead of such oath shall be in the form of such prescribed. oath, substituting the words "sincerely and truly affirm and declare" for the word "swear," and omitting the words "So help me God."

4. Where no form of oath has been prescribed as aforesaid, the form of Form of affirmation 20 affirmation and declaration to be made under the provisions of this Act instead and declaration of such oath shall be as follows :-

"I do solemnly and sincerely affirm and declare-

"(1). That I conscientiously object to the taking of an oath.

Penalty for refusing to make affirmation and declaration. 5. The making an affirmation and declaration in any manner authorized by this Act, whether the same be made orally or in writing, shall in all respects have the same effect as the taking the oath for which the same is substituted.

6. If any person permitted by this Act to make an affirmation and declaration instead of an oath declines, neglects, or refuses to make such affirmation and declaration, he shall be subject to the same penalties and disabilities (if any) as he would have been subjected to for declining or neglecting to take the oath for which the affirmation and declaration provided by this Act is allowed to be substituted.

Penalty for making false statement.

7. If any person shall knowingly and wilfully make any false statement in 10 any such affirmation and declaration, he shall be liable to the penalties attached by any law in force for the time being to the offence of wilful and corrupt perjury.
