A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to provide for the Payment by the Public Trustee of certain Moneys received by him on Account of the Auckland and Onehunga Native Hostelries to the Account of the Civil List for Native Purposes. Title.

WHEREAS certain parcels of land at Auckland and Onehunga were vested in Her Majesty the Queen by "The Auckland and Onehunga Native Hostelries Act, 1867," for the purposes of and as an endowment for native hostelries: And whereas a parcel of land at Blackett's Point, near Auckland, has been reserved for the like purpose, and the several parcels of land with the buildings erected on one of such parcels, known as the Auckland Native Hostelry (hereinafter called "the said hostelry"), are now under the management of the Public Trustee, and moneys have accumulated in his hands from the rents and profits of the said land, and there now remains in his hands after making all necessary disbursements a sum exceeding one thousand pounds: And whereas it is expedient that that sum and all future rents and profits arising from the said land should be paid to the account of the Civil List for Native purposes: Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Auckland and Onehunga Native Hostelries Act, 1889." Short Title.

2. The said sum of money now in the hands of the Public Trustee shall be paid over by him to the account of the Civil List for Native Purposes. Payment of accumulated funds to Civil List.

3. The said Public Trustee shall, when requested so to do by the Native Minister, from time to time pay over to the same account all rents and profits that may have accumulated in his hands on account of the said parcels of land or of the said hostelry, after deducting therefrom all necessary disbursements in respect of the same. Future payments to be made on request.

20 BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Auckland and Onehunga Native Hostelries Act, 1889." Short Title.

25 **2.** The said sum of money now in the hands of the Public Trustee shall be paid over by him to the account of the Civil List for Native Purposes. Payment of accumulated funds to Civil List.

Future payments to
be made on request.

3. The said Public Trustee shall, when requested so to do by the Native Minister, from time to time pay over to the same account all rents and profits that may have accumulated in his hands on account of the said parcels of land or of the said hostelry, after deducting therefrom all necessary disbursements in respect of the same. 5

New clause.

Account to be kept.

4. A separate account shall be kept of the expenditure of any of the money available from this source, and a return of the expenditure shall be presented annually to Parliament. 10
