An Act to apply a Sum of Money out of the Consolidated Fund and Title. other Moneys to the Service of the Year ending the Thirty-first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine,

and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this present Session. MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's most Address.

dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of 10 Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:— 15

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Appropriation Act, 1888." Short Title.

### GRANTS OUT OF THE PUBLIC ACCOUNT.

2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Grant of £1,331,406 Fund, and apply towards making good the Supplies granted to Her Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day 20 of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the sum of one million three hundred and thirty-one thousand four hundred and six pounds, together with the amount of the fees hereinafter mentioned. No. 144—1.

APPROPRIATION OF GRANTS.

Appropriation of £2,102,221 out of Consolidated Fun and fees.

Provision for salaries and expenses chargeable to "State Forests Account," £2.830.

Provision for salaries, &c., in Public Trust Office, £5,050.

Provision for salaries, &c., in Insurance Department, £45,617. 3. All sums granted by this Act and the other Acts mentioned in Schedule A annexed hereto out of the Consolidated Fund amounting, as appears by the said Schedule A, to two millions one hundred and two thousand two hundred and twenty one pounds, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorized to retain the same in lieu of salary, are appropriated for the purposes and services expressed in the several votes in the Schedule B annexed hereto.

4. And whereas by the thirteenth section of "The New Zealand State Forests Act, 1885," it is enacted that the salaries of all officers 10 and servants engaged in or about the administration of the said Act, and all other expenses whatsoever to be incurred in such administration, shall be subject to the appropriation of the General Assembly: Be it enacted that the salaries and expenses for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, 15 shall be for the amounts set forth in Schedule C annexed hereto, not exceeding in the whole the sum of two thousand eight hunred and thirty pounds.

5. And whereas by the eleventh section of "The Public Trust Office Act, 1872," it is enacted that the salary of the Public Trustee 20 and of the other officers and servants in the Public Trust Office shall be such as shall be fixed by the General Assembly: Be it enacted that the said salaries, and contingencies, for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, shall be for the amounts set forth in Schedule D annexed hereto, not 25 exceeding in the whole the sum of five thousand and fifty pounds.

6. And whereas by the thirty-ninth section of "The Government Insurance and Annuities Act, 1874," and the fourth section of "The Government Life Insurance Act, 1886," re-enacting the same, it is provided that the salary of the Commissioner and other officers 30 and other contingent expenses shall be paid out of moneys from time to time appropriated from the Government Insurance Account for the purpose by the General Assembly: Be it enacted, the said salaries and expenses for the period ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, shall be for the 35 amounts set forth in the Schedule E annexed hereto, not exceeding in the whole the sum of forty-five thousand six hundred and seventeen pounds.

If within any financial year it becomes necessary to exceed the amounts hereby voted for the salaries of clerks, or for 40 contingent expenses, the Government Insurance Commissioner may, with the sanction of the Colonial Treasurer, but not otherwise, pay such money in excess; and an account of such expenditure in excess, certified by the Controller and Auditor-General, shall be laid before Parliament within ten days after the then next meeting thereof, and the amount of such excess shall be included in the Unauthorised Expenditure Account of the following year.

7. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and pay out of the Consolidated Fund all moneys lawfully payable to any 50 Natives under and by virtue of the agreements validated by "The

in virtue of any such agreement.

8. There shall be issued and paid by the Colonial Treasurer out Subsidies to be paid 5 of the Consolidated Fund to the Council or Board of each county, to local bodies. road district, town district, and borough, in respect of the general rates described in the Schedule to "The Local Bodies' Finance and Powers Act, 1885" (in this section referred to as "the said Act"), levied for the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand 10 eight hundred and eighty-nine, and actually collected on or before the thirtieth day of June ensuing next after the said thirty-first day of March, one-fourth of the amounts to which they would be entitled under the plan of distribution described in the Schedule to the said Act : 15

Provided that seventy-five per centum, and no more, of the amount which it is estimated by the Property-tax Conmissioner may become payable to any local body may be advanced to such local body within the year ending the thirty-first day of March, one thousand

eight hundred and eighty-nine:

30

Provided also that on receipt by the Property-tax Commissioner of returns, duly verified by the declaration of the Chairman or Treasurer of a local body, showing the amount of the rates aforesaid actually collected to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, the amount of subsidy found to be payable 25 in respect of such rates, less the amount (if any) advanced as aforesaid, shall be paid to such local body; and any sum advanced in excess of the amount so found to be payable shall be repaid by the local body to the Public Account or be recovered by the Colonial Treasurer out of any moneys payable to such local body.

In case any doubt arises as to the several payments to be made under this section and the Schedule to the said Act, or as to payments to be made in respect of newly-formed districts wherein the Board has not had sufficient time to levy and collect rates, the Governor in Council may authoritatively decide the amounts of such payments.

- 35 9. And whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority Indemnity. of section forty-four of "The Public Revenues Act, 1878," issued during the twelve months ended the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight, in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the sum of seventy-six thousand one hundred and ninety-two pounds sixteen shillings from the Consolidated Fund, and a further sum of one thousand and thirty-seven pounds fourteen shillings and sevenpence from the Government Insurance Account, and has discharged from the accounts the sum of nine pounds fifteen shillings due to but irrecoverable by the Crown, and has caused the said sums to be applied to the several purposes and services mentioned in the Schedule F hereto annexed: Be it enacted that the application and discharge of the said sums is hereby
- 10. Whereas certain moneys amounting in the whole to the sum Payments to certain 50 of two thousand two hundred and forty pounds twelve shillings and charitable ninepence were issued and paid out of the Public Account to the institutions to be several hospitals and benevolent institutions mentioned in Schedule

G to this Act by way of subsidy in respect of contributions received from District and Charitable Aid Boards by the said institutions before they became incorporated as "separate institutions" under "The Hospitals and Charitable Institutions Act. 1885:" and whereas it is expedient to give the said institutions time to repay the moneys so paid to them as aforesaid:

Be it therefore enacted that the issue of the said moneys is hereby sanctioned, and the same shall be recovered by, and paid to, the Consolidated Fund by ten equal annual instalments to be retained by the Colonial Treasurer out of any subsidies which may from time 10 to time hereafter become payable to the said separate institutions.

Moneys payable for works may be paid

11. The moneys payable under this Act for roads or other public roads or other public works may be paid over to such local governing bodies as the Minister over to local bodies. for Public Works or other Minister may determine, upon such terms and conditions as shall be agreed upon between the said Public 15 Works or other Minister and any such local governing body; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments in accordance with any such agreement.

Provision for charges or expenses incurred by local governing bodies.

12. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorized to issue and pay out of the Consolidated Fund, by way of temporary advance, any 20 sum or sums, not exceeding one thousand pounds in the whole, for the purpose of defraying any charges or expenses incurred by or on behalf of any local governing body.

All such advances shall be repaid to the Consolidated Fund out of the first moneys thereafter accruing to such local 25 governing body, and may be deducted or recovered by the Colonial Treasurer accordingly.

For the purposes of this section the expression "local governing body" means a County Council, Borough Council, Town Board, Road Board, River Board, and an Education 30 Board, and includes any other body or persons however designated to whom any moneys are paid or payable out of the Consolidated Fund.

13. The Schedules annexed hereto, with the notes, if any, to such Schedules, shall be deemed to be part of this Act, in the same 35 manner as if they had been contained in the body thereof.
