The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to arrange with any or all of the banking institutions doing business in this colony for the purchase on their behalf (including the expenses incidental thereto), without further appropriation than this Act, of silver and bronze coin from the Royal Mint in London, or from any branch thereof in 15 Australia, to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand pounds.

13. The Colonial Treasurer may transfer any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole six hundred and fifty thousand pounds from the Consolidated Fund to the Public Works Fund, to be issued and applied to the purposes and services provided for in this Act. 20

14. It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to enter into any contracts, or to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act: Provided that in the case of the works and services specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto the 25 amount of liability thereby incurred shall not, together with the sum appropriated therefor, exceed the sum set down in the ninth column in that Schedule opposite to each such work or service.

15. Out of the moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of public roads, and such other public works as are usually 30 constructed by or are under the control of local governing bodies, sums may be paid over to such local governing body or bodies as the Minister in charge of the department in connection with which such roads or works are constructed determines, to such amounts and upon such terms and conditions as such Minister prescribes, 35 to be expended by such body upon any of the works or services for which the same are appropriated by this Act; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments accordingly.

The payment of fares and freights by land or sea in respect of the transit of such workers, their families and effects, to or from their work; (i.) The cost of any material or stores required for the effectual carrying-out of any of the aforesaid works or purposes; 10 and (*i*.) The payment of compensation and costs payable under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," in respect of injuries to workers employed on any of the aforesaid works. 15 (2.) The cost of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, or other requisites sold or lent to workers as aforesaid may be deducted from time to time in one or more sums of money from the money earned, whether by day-labour or by co-operative contract, by the person to whom the same are sold or lent. 2017.
