MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,-We, Your Majesty's most Address. dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply

- 10 which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted : And be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in this present Parliament assembled, and
- 15 by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Appropriation Act, short Title. 1904."

2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Con- Grant of #1,404,806, solidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His and fees, out of Consolidated Fund.

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4. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Public Works Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the works and services of the year ending as aforesaid, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of four 10 hundred and thirty-five thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven pounds.

5. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the Public Works Fund by this Act, together with the sums granted out of that fund by the other Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, amounting in 15 the whole one million four hundred and sixty-one thousand one hundred and ninety pounds, as appears by the said Second Schedule, are hereby appropriated for the several works and services expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said Second Schedule. 20

6. Out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Abstract in the Third Schedule hereto the Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending as aforesaid, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of one hundred and sixty-one thousand 25 five hundred and twenty pounds.

7. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the said respective accounts by this Act, together with the sums granted out of those accounts by the other Acts mentioned in the said Third Schedule hereto, amounting in the whole to four hundred and sixty-six 30 thousand three hundred and forty-nine pounds, as appears by the said Schedule, are hereby appropriated for the respective services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said Third Schedule.

8. Whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority 35 of section forty-eight of "The Public Revenues Act, 1891," issued, during the twelve months ended the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and four, in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the respective sums mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereto, out of the Consolidated Fund, the Public Works 40 Fund, and the other accounts mentioned in the said Schedule, amounting in the whole to the sum of sixty-two thousand nine hundred and fifty-two pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence, and has also discharged from the Public Account the sum of fourteen pounds fourteen shillings, mentioned in the said Schedule as being 45 due to but irrecoverable by the Crown, and has caused the said sums to be applied to the several purposes and services mentioned in the said Fifth Schedule: Be it enacted that the application and discharge of the said sums are hereby sanctioned.

(3.) On receipt by the Valuer-General of returns, duly verified by the declaration of the Chairman or Treasurer of a local body,

- 15 showing the amount of the rates aforesaid actually collected to the said thirtieth day of June, the amount of subsidy found to be payable in respect of such rates, less the amount (if any) advanced as aforesaid, shall be paid to such local body; and any sum advanced in excess of the amount so found to be payable

(4.) Where a local body has adopted "The Rating on Un-improved Value Act, 1896," no subsidy shall be payable on any 25 amount exceeding the sum which would be recoverable on a rate of three farthings in the pound on the capital or gross value of the rateable property in its district.

(5.) The provisions of the first paragraph of the Schedule to the said Act, and of the last preceding subsection hereof, shall 30 apply to subsidies payable to Borough Councils under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1900."

(6.) In case any doubt arises as to the several payments to be made under this section, or as to payments to be made in respect of newly formed districts wherein the local body has not

35 had sufficient time to levy and collect rates, the Governor in Council may decide the amounts of such payments, and his decision shall be final.

10. (1.) The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to issue Authority to make and pay out of the Consolidated Fund, by way of temporary to local governing 40 advance, any sum or sums, not exceeding in the whole the sum bodies.

The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to arrange with any or all of the banking institutions doing business in this colony for the purchase on their behalf (including the expenses incidental thereto), without further appropriation than this Act, of silver and bronze coin from the Royal Mint in London, or from any branch thereof in 15 Australia, to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand pounds.

13. The Colonial Treasurer may transfer any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole six hundred and fifty thousand pounds from the Consolidated Fund to the Public Works Fund, to be issued and applied to the purposes and services provided for in this Act. 20

14. It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to enter into any contracts, or to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act: Provided that in the case of the works and services specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto the 25 amount of liability thereby incurred shall not, together with the sum appropriated therefor, exceed the sum set down in the ninth column in that Schedule opposite to each such work or service.

15. Out of the moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of public roads, and such other public works as are usually 30 constructed by or are under the control of local governing bodies, sums may be paid over to such local governing body or bodies as the Minister in charge of the department in connection with which such roads or works are constructed determines, to such amounts and upon such terms and conditions as such Minister prescribes, 35 to be expended by such body upon any of the works or services for which the same are appropriated by this Act; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments accordingly.

16. (1.) The moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction or improvement of railways, roads, bridges, buildings, and other 40 public works shall be available for all or any of the following purposes :-

- (a.) The construction of railways, and the construction and repair of roads, drains, buildings, bridges, jetties, and wharves: 45
- (b.) The protection of and improvement of the navigation of rivers and lakes;
- (c.) The acquisition of land;
- (d.) The payment of salaries, allowances, and travelling-expenses, and the wages of workers ; 50

- (f.) The purchase of furniture and fittings for public buildings, and the payment of wages and purchase of furniture, provisions, and other necessaries for the maintenance of sanatoria and other establishments for which money is 55 appropriated;

23. The sum of one hundred pounds to be paid out of Vote No. 3, in Class I., Legislative Departments, to Sir W. J. 24. Whereas out of the State Coal-mines Account various sums. amounting in the whole to fifty-eight thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight pounds, have been expended in acquiring and partially completing the Point Elizabeth Railway, and it is expedient that the 20 said railway should be treated as part of the Government railways: Be it therefore enacted as follows :-

- (a.) The said sum of fifty-eight thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight pounds is hereby appropriated out of the Public Works Fund, and shall be transferred to the credit of the State Coal-mines Account.
- (b.) On such transfer being made the said railway shall cease to be under "The State Coal-mines Act, 1901," and shall be deemed to be a Government railway duly constructed under the authority of a special Act.
