An Act to appropriate and apply certain Sums of Money out of Title. the Consolidated Fund, the Public Works Fund, and other Accounts to the Services of the Year ending the Thirty-first Day of March, One thousand nine hundred and seven, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Present Session.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's most Address. dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand, in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply 10 which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in this present Parliament assembled, and

15 by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

Grant of £2,140,853 and fees, out of Consolidated Fund.

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Appropriation Act, 1906."
2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Con-

2. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Consolidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and seven, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of two million one hundred and forty thousand eight hundred and fifty-three pounds, together with the amount of the fees hereinafter mentioned.

Appropriation of £4,803,915, and fees, out of Consolidated Fund.

3. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the Consolidated Fund 10 by this Act, together with the sums granted out of that fund by the other Acts mentioned in First Schedule hereto, amounting in the whole to four million eight hundred and three thousand nine hundred and fifteen pounds, as appears by the said Schedule, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorised to retain the same in lieu of salary, are hereby appropriated for the several services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said First Schedule.

Grant of £1,141,050 out of Public Works Fund.

4. The Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply out of the Public Works Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to 20 His Majesty for the works and services of the year ending as aforesaid, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of one million one hundred and forty-one thousand and fifty pounds.

Appropriation of £2,852,789 out of Public Works Fund.

5. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the Public Works Fund by this Act, together with the sums granted out of that fund by the 25 other Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, amounting in the whole to two million three hundred and fifty-two thousand seven hundred and eighty-nine pounds, as appears by the said Second Schedule, are hereby appropriated for the several works and services expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said 30 Second Schedule.

Grant of £270,933 out of separate accounts.

6. Out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Abstract in the Third Schedule hereto the Colonial Treasurer may issue and apply, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending as aforesaid, any sums not 35 exceeding in the whole the sum of two hundred and seventy thousand nine hundred and thirty-three pounds.

Appropriation of £610,853 out of eparate accounts. 7. All sums granted as aforesaid out of the said respective accounts by this Act, together with the sums granted out of those accounts by the other Acts mentioned in the said Third Schedule 40 hereto, amounting in the whole to six hundred and ten thousand eight hundred and fifty-three pounds, as appears by the said Schedule, are hereby appropriated for the respective services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Abstract in the said Third Schedule.

Indemnity as to unauthorised expenditure of £104,884 6s. 2d., and debts irrecoverable, £108 13s. 2d. 8. Whereas the Colonial Treasurer has, under the authority of section forty-eight of "The Public Revenues Act, 1891," issued, during the twelve months ended the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and six, in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the respective sums mentioned in the Fifth 50 Schedule hereto, out of the Consolidated Fund, the Public Works

Fund, and the other accounts mentioned in the said Schedule, amounting in the whole to the sum of one hundred and four thousand eight hundred and eighty-four pounds six shillings and twopence, and has also discharged from the Public Account the sum 5 of one hundred and eight pounds thirteen shillings, and twopence. mentioned in the said Schedule as being due to but irrecoverable by the Crown, and has caused the said sums to be applied to the several purposes and services mentioned in the said Fifth Schedule: Be it enacted that the application and discharge 10 of the said sums are hereby sanctioned.

9. (1.) There shall be issued and paid by the Colonial Trea- Subsidies to be paid surer out of the Consolidated Fund to the Council or Board of each to local bodies county, road district, and town district, in respect of the general rates described in the Schedule to "The Local Bodies' Finance 15 and Powers Act, 1885" (in this section referred to as "the said Act "), levied for the year ending as aforesaid, and actually collected on or before the thirtieth day of June ensuing next after the said thirty-first day of March, one-fourth of the amounts to which they would be entitled under the plan of distribution described in the

20 Schedule to the said Act.

(2.) Upon the application of the local body, setting forth the amount of general rates collectible for the year ending the said thirty-first day of March, and showing separately how much thereof is in respect of Native lands, seventy-five per centum, and no 25 more, of the amount which it is estimated by the Valuer-General may become payable to such local body for rates other than rates on Native lands may be advanced to such local body within that year.

(3.) On receipt by the Valuer-General of returns, duly verified by the declaration of the Chairman or Treasurer of a local body, 30 showing the amount of the rates aforesaid actually collected to the said thirtieth day of June, the amount of subsidy found to be payable in respect of such rates, less the amount (if any) advanced as aforesaid, shall be paid to such local body; and any sum advanced in excess of the amount so found to be payable 35 shall be repaid by the local body to the Public Account, or be recovered by the Colonial Treasurer out of any moneys payable to such local body.

(4.) Where a local body has adopted "The Rating on Unimproved Value Act, 1896," no subsidy shall be payable on any 40 amount exceeding the sum which would be recoverable on a rate of three farthings in the pound on the capital or gross value of the

rateable property in its district.

(5.) The provisions of the first paragraph of the Schedule to the said Act, and of the last preceding subsection hereof, shall 45 apply to subsidies payable to Borough Councils under "The Muni-

cipal Corporations Act, 1900."

(6.) In case any doubt arises as to the several payments to be made under this section, or as to payments to be made in respect of newly formed districts wherein the local body has not 50 had sufficient time to levy and collect rates, the Governor in Council may decide the amounts of such payments, and his decision shall be final.

Authority to make temporary advances to local governing bodies.

10. (1.) The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to issue and pay out of the Consolidated Fund, by way of temporary advance, any sum or sums, not exceeding in the whole the sum of one thousand pounds, for the purpose of defraying any charges or expenses incurred by or on behalf of any local governing 5 body.

(2.) All such advances shall be repaid to the Consolidated Fund out of the first moneys thereafter accruing to such local governing body, and may be deducted or recovered by the Colonial Treasurer

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accordingly.

(3.) For the purposes of this section the expression "local governing body" means a County Council, Borough Council, Town Board, Road Board, River Board, Harbour Board, and an Education Board, and includes any other body or persons, however designated, to whom any moneys are payable out of the Consoli- 15 dated Fund.

Power to pay money in excess of appropriation cut of certain accounts.

11. (1.) Whenever it becomes necessary that money should be expended on account of the Government Insurance Department. the Government Accident Insurance Department, the Public Trust Office, the Government Advances to Settlers Office, or the State Fire 20 Insurance Department, in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the Government Insurance Commissioner, the Public Trustee, the Superintendent, or the General Manager, as the case may be, may, with the sanction of the Colonial Treasurer, but not otherwise, pay such money in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament.

(2.) All such expenditure shall be charged to the Unauthorised

Expenditure Account.

Purchase of silver and bronze coin.

12. The Colonial Treasurer is hereby authorised to arrange with any or all of the banking institutions doing business in this 30 colony for the purchase on their behalf (including the expenses incidental thereto), without further appropriation than this Act, of silver and bronze coin from the Royal Mint in London, or from any branch thereof in Australia, to an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand pounds.

Power to transfer £775,000 from Consolidated Fund to Public Works Fund.

13. The Colonial Treasurer may transfer any sum or sums not exceeding in the whole seven hundred and seventy-five thousand pounds from the Consolidated Fund to the Public Works Fund, to be issued and applied to the purposes and services provided for in this Act.

Power to make contracts in excess of appropriation.

40 14. It shall be lawful for the Governor, in the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, to enter into any contracts, or to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act: Provided that in the case of the works and services specified in the Fourth Schedule 45 hereto the amount of liability thereby incurred shall not, together with the sum appropriated therefor, exceed the sum set down in the ninth column in that Schedule opposite to each such work or service.

Power to pay over to local governing hodies.

15. Out of the moneys appropriated by this Act for the con- 50 struction of public roads, and such other public works as are usually constructed by or are under the control of local governing bodies,

sums may be paid over to such local governing body or bodies as the Minister in charge of the department in connection with which such roads or works are constructed determines, to such amounts and upon such terms and conditions as such Minister prescribes, 5 to be expended by such body upon any of the works or services for which the same are appropriated by this Act; and the Colonial Treasurer shall make all such payments accordingly.

16. (1.) The moneys appropriated by this Act for the con- Money appropriated struction or improvement of railways, roads, bridges, buildings, and for roads, &c., 10 other public works shall be available for all or any of the following purposes:-

- (a.) The construction of railways, and the construction and repair of roads, drains, buildings, bridges, jetties, and wharves;

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- (d.) The payment of salaries, allowances, and travelling-expenses, and the wages of workers;
- (e.) The purchase of material and provisions:
- (f.) The purchase of furniture and fittings for public buildings, and the payment of wages and purchase of furniture, provisions, and other necessaries for the maintenance of sanatoria and other establishments for which money is appropriated;
- (g.) The purchase of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, and other requisites connected with the employment of labour, and whether or not the same are to be used for the benefit of or sold or lent to workers employed on public
- (h.) The payment of fares and freights by land or sea in respect of the transit of such workers, their families and effects, to or from their work;
- (i.) The cost of any material or stores required for the effectual carrying-out of any of the aforesaid works or purposes; and
- (j.) The payment of compensation and costs payable under "The Workers' Compensation for Accidents Act, 1900," in respect of injuries to workers employed on any of the aforesaid works.
- (2.) The cost of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, or other requisites sold or lent to workers as aforesaid may be deducted from time to time, in one or more sums of money, from the money earned, whether by day labour or by co-operative contract, by the person to 45 whom the same are sold or lent.

19. From and after the passing of this Act the cost of collection referred to in section three of "The Local Bodies' Finance and 10 Powers Act, 1885," shall not be defrayed out of the revenues which by virtue of that section form part of the County Fund, and that Act

is hereby amended accordingly.

20. In any case where the Colonial Treasurer is satisfied that any local authority liable to make any payment in respect of the costs 15 and expenses incident to the election and meetings of the Licensing Committee, as provided in section sixteen of "The Alcoholic Liquors Sale Control Act Amendment Act, 1895," has made default in so doing, he may pay the same, and may cause the amount so paid to be recovered from the defaulting local authority as a debt due to 20 the Crown, or to be deducted from any subsidy or other moneys at any time payable by the Government to such local authority.

21. The Public Trustee, with the sanction of the Trust Office Board, may, notwithstanding anything contained in section thirty-seven of "The Public Trust Office Consolidation Act, 1894," or 25 any Act, out of any balance to the credit of the Profit and Loss Account, apply any sum not exceeding fifteen thousand pounds in the purchase of land with buildings thereon, and in any alterations thereto, or in the purchase of land and the erection of buildings thereon, in the City of Wellington, and in providing office accommodation and furniture for the purpose of carrying on the business

of the Public Trust Office.

22. Out of the vote for Miscellaneous Services taken in Class XXI. (Consolidated Fund), under the item "Bonuses or advances to assist fruit-canning factories," the Minister for Agricul-35 ture may grant bonuses or make advances for that purpose to such persons, in such manner, and on such terms in all respects as he thinks fit, and in the case of advances may make the same with or without security and with or without interest, as he thinks fit:

Provided that the total amount of all such bonuses and advances 40

shall not exceed two thousand pounds.

23. Out of the vote for irrigation and water-supply, in Class XXXIX. Public Works Fund, the Minister of Lands may from time to time, as he thinks fit,—

(a.) Construct, purchase, or otherwise acquire water-races, 45 water rights, and other works for irrigation and water-supply in connection with or in aid of the mining and agricultural industries:
