AN Act to appropriate and apply certain Sums of Money out of the Consolidated Fund, the Public Works Fund, and other Accounts to the Services of the Year ending the Thirty-first Day of March, Nineteen hundred and twenty, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Present Session.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,-We. Your Majestv's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session 10 of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted : And be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1919.

2. (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Consolidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty, any sums which, together 20 with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, as amended by Part I of the Finance Act, 1918, do not exceed the sum of twelve million two hundred and forty-three thousand six hundred and ninety pounds, together with the amount of fees hereafter 25 mentioned.

(2.) The sum of twelve million two hundred and forty-three thousand six hundred and ninety pounds as aforesaid, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorized to retain the same in lieu of salary, is hereby appropriated for the 30 services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the First Schedule hereto.

**3.** (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Public Works Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services as aforesaid, any sums which, together 35 with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, as amended by Part I of the Finance Act, 1918, do not exceed the sum of three million and forty thousand four hundred and eighty-seven 40 pounds.

(2.) The sum of three million and forty thousand four hundred and eighty-seven pounds as aforesaid is hereby appropriated for the works and services expressed in the several votes specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

(3.) Where any of the moneys appropriated by this section for 45 the construction, maintenance, and supervision of roads, bridges, and other public works are by the estimates for the current financial year as approved by the House of Representatives allocated for the construction, maintenance, or supervision of any particular road or bridge, the moneys so allocated, or any portion thereof, may be expended for 50

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the construction or maintenance of any other road or bridge (within the district of the same local authority) for which no specific provision is made by the said estimates.

4. (1.) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Grant and 5 respective accounts mentioned in the Third Schedule hereto, towards £2,247,611 out making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services as of separate aforesaid, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, as amended by Part I of the Finance

10 Act, 1918, do not exceed the sum of two million two hundred and forty-seven thousand six hundred and eleven pounds.

(2.) The sum of two million two hundred and forty-seven thousand six hundred and eleven pounds as aforesaid is hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the several 15 votes specified in the said Third Schedule.

5. It shall be lawful for the Governor-General, in the name and Power to make on behalf of His Majesty the King, to enter into any contracts, or contracts in excess to incur any liabilities, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act:

Provided that in the case of the works and services specified in the Fourth Schedule hereto the amount of liability thereby incurred shall not, together with the sum appropriated therefor, exceed the sum set down in the ninth column in that Schedule opposite to each such work or service.

- (h.) The payment of fares and freights by land or sea in respect of the carriage of such workers, their families and effects, to or from their work;

- (j.) The payment of compensation and costs payable under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1908, in respect of injuries to workers employed on any of the aforesaid works; and
- (k.) The payment of damages, compensation, or costs in respect of any injury or damage arising out of the construction or improvement of any such railway, road, bridge, building, or other public work, or out of the taking or acquisition of land for the purposes thereof.

(2.) The cost of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, or other requisites sold or lent to any worker as aforesaid may be deducted from time to time, in one or more sums of money, from the money earned, whether by day labour or by co-operative contract, by the said worker. 40

9. All advances made by the Minister of Finance under the Lands Improvement and Native Lands Acquisition Act, 1894, to settlers for improving their lands, and all expenses connected therewith, whether such advances are made directly to any member of an association or expended by or under the directions of the Minister 45 of Lands, may be paid out of the vote taken in Class XXIX, Public Works Fund, for improved-farm settlements.

10. The Minister of Finance may transfer such sums as he may deem fit from the Consolidated Fund to the War Expenses Account to be issued and applied as provided for in section four of 50 the Finance Act, 1918 (No. 2.). 16. There may be paid out of the Consolidated Fund, without further appropriation than this section, the sum of three hundred and forty thousand pounds, to be distributed among 20 manufacturers of butter either for export or for consumption in New Zealand.

17. No deduction shall be made from the retiring-allowance payable to any retired contributor to the Public Service Superannuation Fund, in respect of remuneration for services rendered by him, 25 while in receipt of a retiring-allowance, to or for any branch of the Government service during the current financial year, notwithstanding that such retiring-allowance and remuneration may exceed the limit fixed by section thirty-seven of the Public Service Classification and Superannuation Act, 1908, as amended by section nine of the 30 Public Service Classification and Superannuation Amendment Act, 1909, if the aggregate amount so received by the contributor as remuneration and retiring-allowance for any month does not exceed the sum of twenty-six pounds five shillings.

18. The authority conferred on the Minister of Finance by 35 section two of the Hauraki Plains Amendment Act, 1913, as from time to time extended, to borrow moneys for the purposes of the Hauraki Plains Act, 1908, is hereby further extended so as to authorize the borrowing of such further moneys as may be required, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of three hundred thousand 40 pounds.

19. The authority conferred on the Minister of Finance by section two of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Amendment Act, 1913, as from time to time extended, to borrow moneys for the purposes of the Rangitaiki Land Drainage Act, 1910, is hereby 45 further extended so as to authorize the borrowing of such further moneys as may be required, not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of two hundred and fifty thousand pounds.

20. Section seventy of the Auckland and Suburban Drainage Authorizing Act, 1908, is hereby amended by omitting from paragraph (b) and also from paragraph (d) the words "four pounds ten shillings," and debentures issued substituting the words "five pounds ten shillings."

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the Public Service Act, 1912, or in any scale of salaries and increments of salary which may be in force under that Act in respect of the Professional 25 and Clerical Divisions of the Public Service, it shall be lawful for the Commissioner under that Act to allow to any officer of either of those Divisions in any year an increment in excess of that to which he is entitled under the scale, if the Commissioner is satisfied that the officer is entitled to such increase by reason of special merit and 30 ability. The decision of the Commissioner to grant or refuse any such increment in excess of the scale shall be final and conclusive, anything to the contrary in the said Act notwithstanding.

(2.) This section shall come into operation on the first day of April, nineteen hundred and twenty, and shall remain in operation 35 until expressly repealed.

42. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Public Service Act, 1912, or in any amendment thereof, or in any schedule in force at the passing of this Act establishing a scale of salaries and increments for officers of the Professional Division or the Clerical Division of the 40 Public Service, as the case may be, the Public Service Commissioner may, in regrading the service as directed by section twenty-two of the Appropriation Act, 1918, extend the maximum salary prescribed for any class by an amount not exceeding twenty pounds in any case. 45

(2.) Any increase in the salary of an officer by reason of the operation of this section may be paid without further appropriation than this section.

(3.) This section shall be deemed to have been in force on and after the first day of April, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and shall 50continue in force until it is specifically repealed.

43. (1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Post and Telegraph Authorizing Department Act, 1918, or in any regulations in force on the passing of this Act under that Act, or in any schedule under those regula- of Post and tions establishing a scale of salaries and increments for officers of Telegraph Department. 5 that Department, the maximum salary therein prescribed for any

modification of prescribed salaries

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class of officers may be extended by an amount not exceeding twenty pounds in any case.

(2.) Any increase in the salary of an officer by reason of the operation of this section may be paid without further appropriation 10 than this section.

(3.) This section shall be deemed to have been in force on and after the first day of April, nineteen hundred and nineteen, and shall continue in force until it is specifically repealed.
