An Acr to appropriate and apply certain Sums of Money out of the Consolidated Fund, the Public Works Fund, and other Accounts to the Services of the Year ending the Thirty-first Day of March, Nineteen hundred and twenty, and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Present Session.

Address.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majestv's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session 10 of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

Short Title.

Grant and appropriation of £12,243,690, and fees, out of Consolidated Fund. 1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1919.

The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Consolidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty, any sums which, together 20 with the sums that have been issued and paid under the provisions of section forty-three of the Public Revenues Act, 1910, as amended by Part I of the Finance Act, 1918, do not exceed the sum of twelve million two hundred and forty-three thousand six hundred and ninety pounds, together with the amount of fees hereafter 25 mentioned.

(2.) The sum of twelve million two hundred and forty-three thousand six hundred and ninety pounds as aforesaid, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorized to retain the same in lieu of salary, is hereby appropriated for the 30 services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the

The Minister of Finance is hereby empowered, without u rther appropriation than this section, to pay to the Greymouth Harbour Board, out of the Consolidated Fund, in anticipation of the revenues payable to that Board pursuant to section seven of the Greymouth Harbour Board Act, 1884, such sum or sums as he thinks fit not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of fifteen thousand pounds

(2.) All moneys advanced to the Greymouth Harbour Board under this section, with interest thereon at such rate as the Minister of Finance may prescribe, shall be deductible from the revenues 10 aforesaid as the same become due and payable, in such manner and subject to such conditions as may be agreed on between the said
