A BILL INTITULED

An Act to appropriate and apply certain Sums of Title.

Money out of the Consolidated Fund and other
Accounts to the Services of the Year ending on the
Thirty-first Day of March, Nineteen hundred and
forty-eight, and to appropriate the Supplies granted
in this Present Session.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Majesty's Address most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assembled,

towards making good the supply which we have cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this session of Parliament, have resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1947.

Grant and appropriation of £86,329,662 out of Consolidated Fund.

2. (1) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the Consolidated Fund, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services of the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and forty-eight, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid out of the Consolidated Fund under the provisions of section fortyseven of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of eighty-six million three hundred and twenty-nine thousand six hundred and sixty-two pounds.

(2) The sums hereinbefore authorized to be applied, together with the fees collected by such public officers as are authorized to retain the same in lieu of salary, are hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the First

Schedule hereto.

- 3. (1) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply out of the respective accounts mentioned in the Second Schedule hereto, towards making good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services as aforesaid, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid out of the said accounts under the provisions of section forty-seven of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of sixty-five million four hundred and eight-six thousand three hundred and twenty-three pounds.
- (2) The sums hereinbefore authorized to be applied are hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

- (3) Where any of the moneys appropriated by this section for the construction, maintenance, and supervision of roads, bridges, and other public works are by the estimates for the current financial year as approved by the House of Representatives allocated for the construction, maintenance, or supervision of any particular road or bridge, the moneys so allocated, or any portion thereof, may be expended for the construction or maintenance of any other road or bridge (within the district of the same local authority) for which no specific provision is made by the said estimates.
- 4. (1) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply Grant and out of the accounts outside the Public Account men- £12,247,155 tioned in the Third Schedule hereto, towards making out of good the supplies granted to His Majesty for the services outside the as aforesaid, any sums which, together with the sums Public Account. that have been issued and paid out of the said accounts under the provisions of section forty-seven of the Public See Reprint Revenues Act, 1926, and the several Imprest Supply Acts of Statutes, vol. VII, p. 26 passed during this present session, do not exceed the sum of twelve million two hundred and forty-seven thousand one hundred and fifty-five pounds.

(2) The sums hereinbefore authorized to be applied are hereby appropriated for the services and purposes expressed in the several votes specified in the Third

Schedule hereto.

5. It shall be lawful for the Governor-General, on Power to make the recommendation of the Minister of Finance, to contracts in excess of enter into any contracts, or to incur any liabilities, in appropriation. the name and on behalf of His Majesty the King, for carrying on the works and services for which money is appropriated by this Act.

6. Whereas the Minister of Finance has, under the Indemnity as to authority of sections three and fifty-eight of the unauthorized expenditure of Public Revenues Act, 1926, issued during the twelve £2,532,677 19s. 5d. months ended the thirty-first day of March, nine- irrecoverable, teen hundred and forty-seven, in excess of or without £892,738 19s. 7d. the appropriation of Parliament, the respective sums Ibid., pp. 11, 28, and 32 mentioned in the Fourth Schedule hereto, out of the Consolidated Fund and the other accounts mentioned in the said Schedule, amounting in the whole to the sum of two million five hundred and thirty-two thousand six hundred and seventy-seven pounds nineteen shillings

and debts

and fivepence, and has caused the said sums to be applied to the several purposes and services mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule, and has also discharged from the Public Account and other accounts the sum of eight hundred and ninety-two thousand seven hundred and thirty-eight pounds nineteen shillings and sevenpence mentioned in the said Schedule as being moneys due to but irrecoverable or abandoned by the Crown, together with the value of stores written off departmental accounts: Be it enacted that the application and discharge of the said sums are hereby sanctioned.

Payment to local authorities for construction of roads, &c. 7. Out of the moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction of public roads, and such other public works as are usually constructed by or are under the control of local authorities, sums may be paid over to such local authorities as the Minister in charge of the Department in connection with which such roads or works are constructed determines, to such amounts and upon such terms and conditions as that Minister prescribes, to be expended by those authorities upon any of the works or services for which the same are appropriated by this Act; and the Minister of Finance may make all such payments accordingly.

8. (1) The moneys appropriated by this Act for the construction or improvement of railways, roads, bridges, buildings, and other public works shall be available for

all or any of the following purposes:-

(a) The construction of railways, and the construction and repair of roads, drains, buildings, bridges, jetties, and wharves:

(b) The protection of rivers and lakes, and the improvement of the navigation thereof:

(c) The acquisition of land, and the payment of interest in respect thereof where necessary:

(d) The payment of salaries, allowances, and travelling-expenses, and the wages of workers:

(e) The purchase of material and provisions:

(f) The purchase of furniture and fittings for public buildings, and the payment of wages and purchase of furniture, provisions, and other necessaries for the maintenance of sanatoria and other establishments for which money is appropriated:

Money appropriated for roads, &c. defined

- (g) The purchase of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, and other requisites connected with the employment of labour, whether or not the same are to be used for the benefit of or sold or lent to workers employed on public works:
- (h) The payment of fares and freights by land or sea in respect of the carriage of such workers, their families and effects, to or from their work:
- (i) The cost of any material or stores required for the effectual carrying-out of any of the aforesaid works or purposes:
- (j) The payment of compensation and costs payable under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1922, and See Reprint amendments, in respect of injuries to workers of Statutes, vol. V, p. 597 employed on any of the aforesaid works:

- (k) The payment of damages, compensation, or costs in respect of any injury or damage arising out of the construction or improvement of any such railway, road, bridge, building, or other public work, or out of the taking or acquisition of land for the purposes thereof.
- (2) The cost of tools, plant, provisions, clothing, or other requisites sold or lent to any worker as aforesaid may be deducted from time to time, in one or more sums of money, from the money earned, whether by day labour or by co-operative contract, by the said worker.
- 9. When any of the votes specified in the Schedules Payments for hereto contains an item under any title which does not specific specifically appropriate expenditure for any particular appropriation. purpose, such item shall be deemed to be an appropriation for expenditure on purposes other than those of the other items of the vote.

10. Out of the moneys appropriated by this Act for Payments to the construction of main highways (including bridges), for construction sums may be paid over to such local authorities as the of main Main Highways Board determines in such amounts and highways. upon such terms and conditions as the Main Highways Board prescribes, to be expended by those local authorities upon any of the works for which the same are appropriated by this Act, and the Minister of Finance may make all such payments accordingly.

Authority to transfer £26,875,000 from National Development Loans Account to other accounts. 1941, No. 7 11. There may be transferred from the National Development Loans Account to the respective accounts mentioned in the Fifth Schedule hereto any sums which, together with the sums that have been so transferred during the current financial year under the provisions of section four of the National Development Loans Act, 1941, and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this present session, do not exceed in respect of any such account the appropriate amount specified in that Schedule, and do not exceed in the aggregate the sum of twenty-six million eight hundred and seventy-five thousand pounds.
