AN ACT to appropriate and apply certain sums of money Title.
out of the Consolidated Fund and other accounts to
the services of the year ending with the thirty-first
5 day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-six, and
to appropriate the supplies granted in this year.

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN,—We, Your Address.
Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the House of
Representatives of New Zealand in Parliament assem-
10 bled, towards making good the supply which we have
cheerfully granted to Your Majesty in this year, have

resolved to grant unto Your Majesty the sums herein-
after mentioned, and do therefore most humbly beseech
Your Majesty that it may be enacted: And be it enacted
by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament
assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows: 5

Short Title.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Appropriation
Act 1955.

(2) This Act relates to the year ending with the
thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-
six (hereinafter referred to as this year). 10

2. (1) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply
out of the Consolidated Fund, towards making good the
supplies granted to Her Majesty for the services of this
year, any sums which, together with the sums that have
been issued and paid out of the Consolidated Fund 15
during this year under section forty-nine of the Public
Revenues Act 1953 and the several Imprest Supply Acts
passed during this year, do not exceed the sum of
one hundred and fifty million fourteen thousand nine
hundred and sixty pounds. 20

(2) The sums hereinbefore authorized to be applied,
together with the fees collected by such public officers
as are authorized to retain them instead of salary, are
hereby appropriated for the services expressed in the
several votes specified in the First Schedule to this Act. 25

3. (1) The Minister of Finance may issue and apply
out of the accounts mentioned in the Second Schedule
to this Act, towards making good the supplies granted
to Her Majesty for the services of this year, any sums
which, together with the sums that have been issued 30
and paid out of those accounts during this year under
section forty-nine of the Public Revenues Act 1953
and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during
this year, do not exceed the sum of one hundred and
fifteen million five hundred and seventy-nine thousand 35
five hundred and sixty five pounds.

(2) The sums hereinbefore authorized to be applied
are hereby appropriated for the services expressed in the
several votes specified in the Second Schedule to this Act.

(3) Where any of the money appropriated by this
section for the construction, maintenance, and super-
vision of roads, bridges, and other public works is by
the estimates for this year as approved by the House of 40

Representatives allocated for the construction, maintenance, or supervision of any particular road or bridge, the money so allocated, or any portion thereof, may be expended for the construction or maintenance of any other road or bridge (within the district of the same local authority) for which no specific provision is made by the said estimates.

4. (1) The Minister of Finance may issued and apply out of the accounts outside the Public Account mentioned in the Third Schedule to this Act, towards making good the supplies granted to Her Majesty for the services of this year, any sums which, together with the sums that have been issued and paid out of those accounts during this year under section forty-nine of the Public Revenues Act 1953 and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this year, do not exceed the sum of twenty-five million five hundred and sixteen thousand four hundred and forty-two pounds.

(2) The sums hereinbefore authorized to be applied are hereby appropriated for the services expressed in the several votes specified in the Third Schedule to this Act.

5. Whereas the Minister of Finance has, under the authority of sections fifty-one and seventy-six of the Public Revenues Act 1953, issued during the year that ended with the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and fifty-five, in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, the respective sums mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to this Act, out of the Consolidated Fund and the other accounts mentioned in the said Schedule, amounting in the whole to the sum of one million one hundred and fifty-three thousand six hundred and fifty-three pounds four shillings and sixpence, and has caused those sums to be applied to the several services mentioned in the said Fourth Schedule, and has also discharged from the Public Account and other accounts the sum of seven hundred and eighty-eight thousand nine hundred and twenty-one pounds three shillings and sevenpence mentioned in the Fifth Schedule to this Act as being money due to but irrecoverable or abandoned by the Crown, together with the value of stores written off departmental accounts: Be it therefore enacted that the application and discharge of the said sums are hereby sanctioned.

6. There may be transferred from the National Development Loans Account to the respective accounts mentioned in the Sixth Schedule to this Act any sums which, together with the sums that have been so transferred during this year under section twelve of the New Zealand Loans Act 1953 and the several Imprest Supply Acts passed during this year, do not exceed in respect of any such account the appropriate amount specified in that Schedule and do not exceed in the aggregate the sum of thirty-seven million pounds. 5 10
