A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Armed Constabulary Act, 1867."

Title.

WHEREAS it is expedient to enable members of the Armed Constabulary to vote at elections of members of the General Assembly:

Preamble.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,
5 as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Armed Constabulary Act 1867 Amendment Act, 1881."

Short Title.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in "The Armed Constabulary Act, 1867," it shall be lawful for any Commandant, Inspector, Sub-inspector or other officer, or for any constable, to vote for the election of a member of the General Assembly.

Officer and constable may vote at election of member of General Assembly.
