ARMED CONSTABULARY ACT 1867 AMENDMENT.

A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Armed Constabulary Act, 1867."

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Armed Constabulary Act 1867 Amendment Act, 1885." Short Title.

2. So much of section twenty-six of "The Armed Constabulary Act, 1867," as prohibits any Commandant, Inspector, Sub-Inspector, or other officer, or any constable enrolled under the said Act, who is employed as part of the Civil Police Force of the colony during the time he shall continue to be so employed, from voting for the election of a member of the General Assembly, is hereby repealed. Civil Police Force may exercise franchise.

The word "street" means the whole of any public highway hereafter to be laid out on the said reclaimed land by or with the sanction of the said Board, and includes every public square or places therein, and every bridge, ford, and ferry on the line of a street.

"Right-of-way" means any way or passage whatsoever over any part of the said reclaimed land, the right to use which is confined or intended to be confined to certain persons or classes of persons, and which is not open or intended to be open to the use of the public generally.

25. So much of the Second Schedule of the said Act as relates to the number, nomination, or appointment, succession to office, and election of the members of the Board, is hereby repealed.

Part of principal Act repealed.
