A BILL INTITULED

An Act amend the Accident Compensation Act 1982

BE IT ENACTED by the Parliament of New Zealand as follows:

5 **1. Short Title**—This Act may be cited as the Accident
Compensation Amendment Act (No. 3) 1989, and shall be read
together with and deemed part of the Accident Compensation
Act 1982 (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

10 **3. Compensation not assignable**—(1) Section 89 of the
principal Act is hereby amended by repealing subsection (5) (as
substituted by section 11 of the Accident Compensation
Amendment Act 1985), and substituting the following
subsection:

15 “(5) Nothing in this section shall affect—
“(a) Sections 4 and 5 of the Maori Housing Act 1935; or
“(b) Sections 87 (1) (b), 88 (3) (a), 103, 104, 105, 106, 106A,
and 106B of the Summary Proceedings Act 1957; or
“(c) Sections 27Y and 71 of the Social Security Act 1964; or

“(d) Section 400 of the Income Tax Act 1976; or

“(e) Sections 105, 110, 118, and 121 of the Family Proceedings Act 1980; or

“(f) Sections 84F to 84M of the District Courts Act 1947.”

repealed:
