A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to constitute Anzac Day a National Holiday.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the Anzac Day Act, 1920.
2. (1.) In commemoration of the part taken by New Zealand troops in the Great War, and in memory of those who gave their lives for the Empire, the twenty-fifth day of April in each year (being the anniversary of the first landing of English, Australian, and New Zealand troops on Gallipoli) shall be known as Anzac Day, and shall be observed throughout New Zealand as a public holiday, and in all respects as if Anzac Day were a Sunday.
- (2.) The Schedule to the Public Holidays Act, 1910 (being a Schedule of bank holidays within the meaning of the Banking Act, 1908) is hereby amended by adding thereto the words "Anzac Day."
