A BILL INTITULED

An Act to remove the Disqualification imposed upon William Tille. Shepherd Allen.

WHEREAS on the trial of an election petition regarding the election Preamble. 5 of a member of the House of Representatives for the Te Aroha Electoral District, the Judges who tried the petition found that William Shepherd Allen had, by his agent, been guilty of an illegal practice, and declared the election void: And whereas such finding has been reported to the House of Representatives, and duly entered 10 in the Journals of the House:

And whereas it appears that the aforesaid election occurred during the absence in England of the said William Shepherd Allen, who had not, and could not have had, any cognisance of the illegal act committed by his agent; and it is expedient under the circum-15 stances that he should be relieved from the penalties or disqualifications imposed by "The Corrupt Practices Act, 1881:"

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same,

The said William Shepherd Allen is hereby freed and dis- Indemnity to charged from and indemnified against all penalties, forfeitures, in- William Shepherd Allen in respect of capacities, and disabilities that he may have incurred by reason of any- election held for 25 thing he may by his agent have done in and about the election held in December, 1890. and for the Te Aroha Electoral District in the month of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety; and, notwithstanding anything he may have done or omitted to do, he shall be eligible for election to a seat in the House of Representatives, and shall hold the ap-30 pointments he held prior to the said election, and possess the privileges he possessed prior to the said election, as if he had not committed any offence under "The Corrupt Practices Prevention Act, 1881," and no proceedings for any offences under "The Corrupt · Practices Prevention Act, 1881," committed by him prior to the 35 passing of this Act shall be commenced against him in any Court:

Provided that the foregoing provisions shall not be taken as altering or in any way affecting the certificate of the Judges that the said Te Aroha election is void.
