An Act for the Prevention of Frauds in the sale of Title. Articles made up in quantities representing a specified weight.

DE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows—

1. The Short Title of this Act shall be "The Act for the Preven-Short Title.

2. The Governor may from time to time by proclamation in the Governor empowered Government Gazette declare this Act to be in operation in any portion to proclaim Act in force. of the Colony to be defined in any such proclamation and from a day to be fixed in such proclamation this Act shall come into operation in the district defined therein.
