The name of the Corporation called "The Auckland College and Grammar School" is hereby changed to that of "The Auckland Grammar School," and their common seal shall be changed accordingly.</p> <p>10 3. Any lands vested or to be hereafter vested in the said Corporation may henceforth be leased, wherever situate, for any term not exceeding ninety-nine years, subject to such conditions as the Board of Governors may think fit, but always by auction, as now provided.
