A BILL INTITULED

AN ACT to amend "The Animals Protection Act, 1880," hereinafter termed "the said Act." Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Animals Protection Act 1880 Amendment Act, 1886." Short Title.

2. All game, as the same is defined by the said Act, at large within any district proclaimed thereunder shall be deemed to be "imported" game, and it shall not be necessary in any proceedings under the said Act to prove the fact of importation into any particular district. Game at large deemed to be "imported" game.

3. It shall be lawful for the Governor, by notification published in the *Gazette*, to prohibit absolutely or for such time as he may think fit the destruction of any bird indigenous to the colony; and any person failing or neglecting to perform all or any of the provisions of such notification shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against the provisions of the said Act. Governor may prohibit the destruction of any indigenous bird.
