## A BILL INTITULED

An Acr in amendment of the Adulteration Prevention Acts. BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Adulteration Prevention Short Title. Amendment Act, 1885." It shall come into force on the first day of January, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-six.

2. For the purposes of "The Adulteration Prevention Act 1880 Definition of batch Amendment Act, 1883," and of all other enactments relating to the loaves, and fancy 10 manufacture of bread, batch loaves and French loaves of bread shall bread. be deemed to be loaves of any shape so baked as to show crumb on any two or more sides thereof; and loaves of any shape so baked as to show crust only on all sides thereof shall be deemed to be fancy bread.
