A BILL INTITULED

An Act to amend the Ashley River Improvement Act, Title. 1925.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New 5 Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Ashley River Short Title. Improvement Amendment Act, 1937, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Ashley River 10 Improvement Act, 1925 (hereinafter ealled referred to as the principal Act).

(2) This Act shall come into force on the first Commencement. day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight.

Altering date of next general election of members of Trust.

2. (1) The next general election of members of the Trust shall be held on the second Wednesday in the month of May in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, and subsequent general elections of members shall be held on the second Wednesday in the month of May in every third year thereafter.

The present elective members of the Trust shall hold office until the election in the month of May in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-eight. 10

(2) Section four of the Ashley River Improvement Amendment Act, 1927, is hereby amended by omitting from subsection three the words "until the next general election of Commissioners to be held pursuant to section 15 twenty-seven of the River Boards Act, 1908", and substituting the words "until the date on which their successors come into office".

Allowances to members of Trust.

3. The Trust may, out of its funds, pay to any of its members such remuneration as it may deem reasonable, 20 not exceeding ten shillings and sixpence per diem, for every day on which he may be engaged on the business of the Trust either in attending meetings of the Trust or any Committee of the Trust, or on business at the request of the Trust, but the amount payable to any 25 member under this section shall not exceed the sum of twelve pounds twelve shillings in any period of twelve months.

4. (1) Section seven of the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting, after the words "Third Schedule 30 thereto", the words

5. The Ashley River Trust is hereby declared to be Ashley River a River Board within the meaning of the River Boards Trust declared Act, 1908, with the special powers and subject to the Board within limitations conferred and imposed by the principal Act.

6. Lands belonging to or vested in the Trust for river Boards conservation or protection or for drainage purposes, and which are either occupied by the Trust or let by it to a tenant for not exceeding more than six months, shall let for term be deemed not to be rateable property within the exceeding 15 meaning of the Rating Act, 1925.

7. (1) The power conferred on the Trust by section twenty-three of the Local Bodies' Loans Act, 1926, is hereby extended to enable the Trust, with the approval of the Audit Office, from time to time, by resolution, to 20 direct any local authority to amend or vary any special authorities by rate made and levied by it by direction of the Trust.

(2) A copy of such resolution under the seal of the Trust and of the approval of the Audit Office shall be transmitted to the local authority, which shall thereupon 25 amend or vary such rate according to the tenor of such resolution.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Fencing Provision for Act, 1908, the Impounding Act, 1908, or any other claims for statute Act, and notwithstanding that such lands, works, to works of 30 plantations, or trees may not be fenced by a fence within Trust by stock the meaning of the Fencing Act, 1908, or the Impounding thereon. Act, 1908, the Trust may claim and recover in any Court of competent jurisdiction from the owner of any cattle (as defined by the Impounding Act, 1908) trespassing 35 on any lands vested in or under the control or management of the Trust full satisfaction for any actual damage sustained by the Trust in consequence of such trespass, or caused by such cattle to such lands or the works, plantations, or trees thereon.
